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# VISIBLE LEARNING AT MOUNT BARKER PRIMARY SCHOOL

Great news if you haven't heard, Steve (our Performing Arts teacher), has joined the Visible Learning team as an Impact Coach and will be working with Annette on Thursdays to do this role. This will add to the impact we are having on teaching and learning by creating and supporting a community of successful learners.

Our focus on making learning visible this year has been on providing and receiving effective feedback and developing the skills of the learning dispositions or characteristics of successful learners.

Teachers have been using Learning Intentions and Success Criteria to support students to understand what it is we want students to learn and how the learning will be achieved. The Learning Intentions and Success Criteria help to provide students with feedback;

What am I trying to achieve?

How much progress have I made so far?

What should I do next?

At the end of term two, staff attended a visible learning workshop that aimed to support teachers to evaluate their impact and plan and implement change to maximise their impact. Teachers will be gathering evidence this term to inform them of their impact.

Teachers will be supporting students to develop the skills of a successful learner as displayed around the school on the successful learner posters. If you are not familiar with them yet they are displayed in the front office. This term we have decided to change from 'Excelsior Awards' at assemblies to awards that recognize students demonstrating the learning dispositions. They are; Collaborate, Questions, Persistent, Risk Taker, Self-Regulate and Creative. In week three we will be presenting students with an award for the disposition 'Collaborate'. In week six we will present awards for a different disposition.

We invite parents to provide feedback on your thoughts about our Visible Learning journey. Have you noticed a change in the way your child/children speak about their learning?
